

Volunteer activity for conservation of the Sarobetsu Mire

The Sarobetsu Mire is a part of the Rishiri–Sarobetsu National Park, and the largest high mire in Japan. Invasion of Sasa plant, which is caused by lowering of groundwater level in the mire, is the most emergent issues for conservation of the mire.

0830 dep. Hotel Toyotomi

0900 walking and visiting the lakes in the forest on the coastal sand dune.

1100 visiting cheese factory and cow barn.

1200 Lunch time at Toyotomi Town Center

1300 Dep. Sarobetsu
