

Volunteer activity for conservation of the Sarobetsu Mire and environmental education for children of Central Kalimantan and Hokkaido

The Sarobetsu Mire is a part of the Rishiri–Sarobetsu National Park, and the largest high mire in Japan. Invasion of Sasa plant, which is caused by lowering of groundwater level in the mire, is the most emergent issues for conservation of the mire.
